Raising Spirits: Grants Open to Boost Victorian Distilleries

Avian influenza detected at fourth property

Agriculture Victoria has confirmed bird flu on a fourth poultry farm in Euroa. This new detection is in close proximity to the 3 other infected properties.

Poultry and bird owners are reminded to keep sheds, yards, aviaries and equipment clean and to restrict contact with wild birds. They should ensure their footwear is clean and wash hands before and after handling birds or eggs. New birds should be quarantined before being integrated with existing ones.

Immediate notification from poultry owners if they notice their poultry are unwell is crucial. Community members must report suspect disease and sudden poultry death by calling the VicEmergency Hotline on 1800 226 226.



Red Meat Conference 18/2/25

Council Agriculture and Livestock Staff attend the Red Meat Conference on 18 February along with 310 farmers, industry representatives and presenters.

Throughout the day staff engaged individually with over 50 stock agents, farmers and business to promote the Livestock Exchange Operating Model survey and the Agriculture Sector Advisory Committee vacancies.

There was a great vibe all day, with sessions very informative and questions presented to delve more deeply into subjects. Well done to the Gippsland Agriculture Group and the Steering Committee for another outstanding event this year.





Partnership in Ag Group

Every six months Agriculture focused services and agencies meet in Bairnsdale. These meetings are invaluable to the agricultural industry as it allows organisations to share what their current focus is, learn what other agencies are planning. This ensures events in the communities are delivered in a collaborative way to minimize disruption to farming families and enable maximum benefit on a single days. You may recognise some of these faces from your community.



Governor Meeting

Gippsland Agriculture Group met with the Governor and Ag representatives from the two shires to discuss options for developing an agriculture training hub in East Gippsland to inspire the next generation to pursue careers in agriculture without having to leave family and the region for three to four years.

The round table representatives included Food and Fibre Gippsland, TAFE, RMIT, One Gippsland, Wellington Shire Council, Gippsland Agriculture Group and the Mayors of the Wellington and East Gippsland Shires.





Ag Careers for Students in Secondary College

Gippsdairy and Council staff have commenced meeting with various education providers to encourage young people to engage in School Based Apprenticeship Training (SBAT) and pathways to increase uptake in Agriculture careers.

To increase numbers in the agriculture streams, there are differing programs to support engagement, one of these is Broadening Horizons, which coordinates student farm and business visits in the region which provide insight into career options and variety available today.

"Raising Aspirations in Careers and Education" a federally funded program, is also visiting the region. RACE provides a focus on the dairy industry and provide a great connection between students and farms via tours. Schools can also participate in the Cows Create Careers program which Council sponsor.

High Country Sales

Over 450 buyers, sellers and observes attended the High Country Sales last week. Well over \$7m changed hands as cattle were sold in Omeo, Benambra, Ensay and Hinnomunjie.

Council Agribusiness Development Officer and Commercial Business team who manage the East Gippsland Livestock Exchange were present, to engage with farmers and promote the Livestock Exchange review which is now open for comment, see article above for YourSay link to provide your feedback as well.

Buyers from as far as Dubbo noted that the quality of cattle from East Gippsland is of a very high standard, good to handle, fatten up well and are highly favoured by the industry. Prices were above last year with sellers we chatted to noting they were pleased with the results.



Orbost Show

Council's Ag and Livestock staff were on hand at the Orbost show last Monday promoting the East Gippsland Livestock Exchange <u>operation model review</u>, the Expressions of Interest for upcoming vacant positions on the <u>Agriculture Sector Advisory Committee</u> and the new Agricultural Leadership Program that council was successful in receiving funding for.

There was also a Grown, Caught, Made Discovery Trail which 50 people registered their interest in by collecting the 'questions, shout out to the 19 people that completed the challenge, which took well over half an hour this year.

We did note that the community laws team were very busy with their 'pets' and the library provided a nice place for quieter times and games for the kids. The waste and sustainability worker was super busy as people were establishing exactly what can go in individual bins each week. Great display team!





Join the Top Soils Project and take part in an innovative soil-testing initiative designed to deepen our understanding of soil conditions across the East Gippsland region. This exciting opportunity allows farmers to gain valuable insights into their paddock's soil health while contributing to a region-wide dataset that tracks long term changes, identifies trends, and helps drive advancements in soil science and sustainable farming practices.

What is it?

The Top Soils Project is conducting a region-wide soil testing initiative designed to collect 200 soil samples across 100 farms in East Gippsland. Soil testing will occur in 2025 and will be repeated in 2028 to monitor changes over time.

Soil testing will be conducted at two depths: 0-10 cm and 10-20cm

Testing will include analyses of:

pH / Acidity: pHw, pHCaCl2, EC:1 Phosphorus: Colwell, Olsen, DGT-P Potassium: Colwell Sulphur: KCl40 Phosphorus Buffering Index (PBI) Australian Texture Class Aluminum MIR Calcium Carbonate Cations Total Nitrogen (N) Nitrate Boron Manganese Copper Zinc Iron Carbon

Why is it important?

This project empowers farmers with a detailed understanding of their soil conditions, enabling them to make informed management decisions. Additionally, it contributes to identifying regional soil trends and provides insights for improving East Gippsland's soil management strategies.

What's new?

The project collaborates with researchers to incorporate advanced soil testing methodologies:

Phosphorus Testing

A cutting-edge method for measuring phosphorus availability tailored to Australia's unique soil conditions. Unlike current tests that may overestimate available phosphorus, this new approach;

- Measures available phosphorus at more relevant chemical and physical Australian soil conditions.
- Can provide predictions for phosphorus application rates required to maximise yields in deficient soils.

Soil Carbon Testing

Leveraging CSIRO-recommended methodologies, this test examines soil quality indicators responding to changes in the rhizosphere caused by management practices and has shown positive correlations with soil microbial biomass, microbial nitrogen, mineralisable nitrogen and total carbohydrates.

By combining traditional and innovative techniques, this project provides unparalleled insights into soil health and productivity.

Participating farmers will receive:

- Expert Guidance: One-on-one support from soil testing specialists.
- Comprehensive Results: Soil test results and a detailed report for your paddock.
- Innovative Research: Be part of cutting-edge research exploring advanced testing techniques and modelling.
- Skill Sharing: Networking opportunities with other producers and support from subject matter experts.

What We Need from You

Farmers participating in the program will be asked to:

- 1. Provide access to a paddock for soil sampling (in 2025 and again in 2028).
- 2. Assist in gathering information on paddock management, such as fertiliser applications and grazing practices.
- 3. Agree to share soil test data and site information with project partners, so that the information can be used in advancing soil testing methodologies with research partners and collated to examine region wide soil trends.
